PAYMENT METHODS

To provide greater flexibility and convenience for parents, Curriculum Contribution payments can be made through Course Confirmation in Compass.

You may elect to pay the charges **in full or in instalments**. The instalments will be automatically debited from your nominated card in three equal payments on the following dates:

Option 2: 3 payments: due on **16/12/2024, 16/2/2025, 16/3/2025**.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

Emerald Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. Please see the Office for an application form at the beginning of the school year.

The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$150 for primary school students per year

- School Saving Bonus of \$400.00 for uniform (until the 30th June 2025), and excursions/activities.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions	Other Contributions	Extra-Curricular Items and Activities
Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.	Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.	Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
